### **September 09**

#### **THE BOOKS OF THE NEW TESTAMENT**

**2 Peter 1:21** "For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.."

### **September 16**

#### **THE BOOKS OF THE OLD TESTAMENT (Genesis – 1 Chronicles)**

**1st Commandment:** "You shall have no other gods." What does this mean? "We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things."

**Matthew 22:37** " You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind."

**Romans 3:20** "For by works of the law no human being will be justified in [God's] sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin."

### **September 23**

#### **THE BOOKS OF THE OLD TESTAMENT (Genesis – Daniel)**

**2nd Commandment:** "You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God." What does this mean? "We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks."

**Psalms 14:1** "The fool says in his heart, 'There is no God.'"

**Romans 13:10** "Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law."

### **September 30**

#### **THE BOOKS OF THE OLD TESTAMENT (Genesis - Malachi)**

**3rd Commandment:** Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." What does this mean? "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

**Hebrews 10:25** "[Let us] not neglect to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encourage one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

**Matthew 5:48** "You therefore must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect."

## October 07

**4th Commandment:** "Honor your father and your mother." What does this mean? "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents and other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them."

**Romans 3:20** "For by works of the law no human being will be justified in [God's] sight since through the law comes the knowledge of sin."

**James 2:10** "For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it."

**Genesis 8:21** "The intention of man's heart is evil from his youth."

## October 14

**5th Commandment:** "You shall not murder." What does this mean? "We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and support him in every physical need."

**6th Commandment:** You shall not commit adultery. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other.

**Matthew 19:6** "So they are no longer two but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate."

## October 21

**7th Commandment:** "You shall not steal." What does this mean? "We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income."

**8th Commandment:** "You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor" What does this mean? "We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way."

**Matthew 7:12** "So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets."

## **October 28**

**9th Commandment:** “You shall not covet your neighbor's house.”

**10th Commandment:** “You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.”

**What does this mean?** “We should fear and love God so that we do not scheme to get our neighbor's inheritance or house, or get it in a way which only appears right, but help and be of service to him in keeping it.”

## **November 04**

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, whose kingdom will have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets. And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

## **November 11**

**The Meaning of the First Article:** “I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses and still takes care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all that I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does, only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise serve and obey him. This is most certainly true.”

## **November 18**

**Psalms 119:105** "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

**Hebrews 11:1** "Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see."

**Matthew 7:7,8** "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you.<sup>8</sup> For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened."

**John 10:27-28** "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand."

## **December 02**

**Acts 4:12** "And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

**1 Timothy 2:5** "For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus."

**Hebrews 13:8** "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."

**2 Corinthians 5:15** "He died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised."

## **December 09**

**The Meaning of the Second Article:** "I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity and true man, born of the Virgin Mary is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death and from the power of the devil;" not with gold or silver, but with his holy precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I might be His own, and live under Him in His kingdom, and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true."

## **December 16**

**John 3:16** “For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.”

**1 Corinthians 15:55-57** “O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

**2 Corinthians 5:21** “For our sake [God] made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.”

## **January 06**

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the Kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever.

**Job 19:25-27** “For I know that my Redeemer lives, and at the last he will stand upon the earth. And after my skin has been thus destroyed, yet in my flesh I shall see God, whom I shall see for myself, and my eyes shall behold, and not another. My heart faints within me!”

## **January 13**

**The Meaning of the Third Article:** “I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength, believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; by the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ. In the one true faith. In this Christian church, He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Jesus Christ. This is most certainly true.”

## January 20

**Ephesians 2:8-10** “For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.”

**1 Peter 2:9** “But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.”

**Ephesians 4:3-6** “[Be] eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call— one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

## January 27

**1 John 1:8-9** “If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. <sup>9</sup> If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.”

**“What is baptism?** Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word.”

**“Which is that word of God?”** Christ our Lord says In the last chapter of Matthew: ‘Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.’ Matthew 28:19

**Hebrews 11:6** “And without faith it is impossible to please God.”

## February 03

**1 Corinthians 12:3** “No one can say, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ except in the Holy Spirit.”

**“What benefits does Baptism give?** It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.”

**“Which are these words and promises of God?”** Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark: ‘Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned.’ Mark 16:16

## **February 10**

**“How can water do such great things?** Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this word of God in the water. For without God's word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit.”

**Titus 3:5-6** “He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior.”

## **February 17**

**“What does such baptizing with water indicate?”** It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.”

**Romans 6:3-4** “Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life..”

## **February 24**

**“What is the Office of the Keys?** The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His Church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.” As St. John writes in chapter twenty: The Lord Jesus breathed on His disciples and said, ‘Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven.’”

### **March 03**

**“What Is Confession?** Confession has two parts: First, that we confess our sins, and Second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.”

**“Which sins should we confess?** Consider your place in life according to the Ten Commandments: are you a father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, or worker? Have you been disobedient, unfaithful, or lazy? Have you been hot-tempered, rude, or quarrelsome? Have you hurt someone by your words or deeds? Have you stolen, been negligent, wasted anything, or done any harm?”

### **March 10**

**The Common Confession:** “O almighty God, merciful Father, I, a poor miserable sinner, confess to You all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended You and justly deserved Your punishment now and forever. But I am heartily sorry for them and sincerely repent of them, and I pray You of Your boundless mercy and for the sake of the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to be gracious and merciful to me, a poor sinful being.”

### **March 17**

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: 'Take eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me.' In the same way also, He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them saying: 'Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.' “

**1 Corinthians 10:16** “The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ?”



## **March 24**

**What is the Sacrament of the Altar?** “It is the true body and blood of our lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink.”

**“What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?** These words: 'Given and shed of you for the forgiveness of sins', show that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given to us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation.”

## **April 07**

**1 Corinthians 11:29** “For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself.”

**“How can bodily eating and drinking do such great things?** Certainly not just eating and drinking does these things, but the words written here: 'Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins.' These words along with bodily eating and drinking, are the main thing in the Sacrament. Whoever believes these words has exactly what they say: 'Forgiveness of sins.’”

## **April 14**

**“Our Father who art in heaven.”** What does this mean? “With these words God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear father.”

**“How is God's name kept holy?** God's name is kept holy when the Word of God is taught in its truth and purity, and we, as the children of God, also lead holy lives according to it.”

## **April 21**

**“How does God's kingdom come?** God's kingdom comes when our heavenly Father gives us His Holy Spirit, so that by His grace we believe His holy Word and lead godly lives here in time and there in eternity.”

**“How is God's will done?** God's will is done when He breaks and hinders every evil plan and purpose of the devil, the world, and our sinful nature, which do not want us to hallow God's name or let His kingdom come; and when He strengthens and keeps us firm in His Word and faith until we die. This is His good and gracious will.”

## **April 28**

**“Give us this day our daily bread. What does this mean?** God certainly gives daily bread to everyone without our prayers, even to all evil people, but we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this, and receive our daily bread with thanksgiving.

**“What is meant by daily bread?** Daily bread includes everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home, land, animals, money, goods, a devout husband or wife, devout children, devout workers, devout and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, self-control, good reputation, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like.”

## **May 5**

**“And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. What does this mean?** We pray in this petition that our Father in heaven would not look at our sins, or deny our prayer because of them. We are neither worthy of the things for which we pray, nor have we deserved them, but we ask that He would give them all to us by grace, for we daily sin much and surely deserve nothing but punishment. So we too will sincerely forgive and gladly do good to those who sin against us.”

**“And lead us not into temptation. What does this mean?** God tempts no one. We pray in this petition that God would guard and keep us so that the devil, the world, and our sinful nature may not deceive us or mislead us into false belief, despair, and other great shame and vice. Although we are attacked by these things, we pray that we may finally overcome them and win the victory.”

## **May 12**

**“But deliver us from evil. What does this mean?** We pray in this petition, in summary, that our Father in heaven would rescue us from every evil of body and soul, possessions and reputation, and finally, when our last hour comes, give us a blessed end, and graciously take us from this valley of sorrow to Himself in heaven.”

**“What does Amen mean?** This means that I should be certain that these petitions are pleasing to our Father in heaven, and are heard by Him; for He Himself has commanded us to pray in this way and has promised to hear us. Amen, amen, which means ‘Yes, yes, it shall be so.’
